TAKE CAUTION WHEN USING FIRE BLANKETS

The Office of the Fire Marshal (OFM) is cautioning Ontarians on the purchase and use of fire blankets as an active fire protection device in the home.

While fire blankets are increasingly advertised as an effective way to extinguish, for example, stovetop fires, there are no Canadian standards that apply to fire blankets and the use of fire blankets in Ontario is not required by law.

The OFM is concerned that a fire blanket may give a false sense of security and fire safety.

The OFM would like to stress that it does not endorse the use of fire blankets for consumer use, and that fire blankets should only be used by trained professionals. Fire blankets are considered by the OFM to be a non-essential product in the home. The OFM continues to recommend to the public tried and tested fire safety practices in the home, including:

- Cooking fires: Keep a proper fitting lid near the stove when cooking. If a pot catches fire, slide the lid over the pot, turn off the stove and do not move the pot until it has cooled
- Smoke alarms: Install smoke alarms on every storey of the home and outside all sleeping areas. For added protection, the fire service recommends installing a smoke alarm in every bedroom. Test smoke alarms monthly and replace the battery at least once a year. Replace smoke alarms every 10 years.
- Home fire escape plans: Develop a home fire escape plan with everyone in the household and discuss how each person will get out of the home in a fire. Practice the home fire escape plan with everyone in the household.

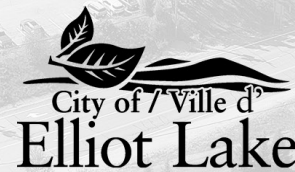

REMEMBER YOUR PETS IN AN EMERGENCY

The City of Elliot Lake By-law Department would like to take this opportunity to remind residents to not forget about their pets when they are doing their emergency preparedness. The following is a good generalized list of what pet owners should keep on hand in times of emergency.

- Food and water for at least three days, including bowls.
- Keep Leashes, collars, tags and pet carriers / crates at the ready.
- Ensure to have comfort items like toys and treats.
- If you can, have your pet micro chipped.
- Ensure your pet's license and registration information is up to date and current.
- Keep a recent photo of your pet and a recent photo with you or a family member with your pet.
- Write down a list of contact numbers for your Veterinarian.
- Remember vaccination and medical records along with any medications your pet may require.
- Carry some pet first aid supplies along with gloves.
- Keep an up to date list of pet friendly hotels.
- Keep a good supply of pet sanitation bags on hand.
- Always have a supply of clean blankets and towels, grooming instruments, along with fresh batteries.

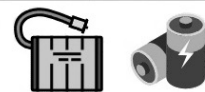
Pet preparedness starts with you the owner. Having a plan and good preparedness will ensure that you encounter less difficulties, stress and worry when having to navigate an emergency situation.

HOW TO HANDLE LITHIUM-ION BATTERIES

DO'S



Purchase and use devices that are listed by a qualified testing lab.



Only used the battery and charging cord designed for the device.



Keep devices and batteries at room temperature.



Store batteries away from flammable objects.

DON'TS



Do not leave devices plugged in once fully charged.



Do not charge the device under your pillow, on your bed, or on a couch.



Do not charge devices at temperatures below 32°F or above 105°F.



Do not discard lithium-ion batteries in the trash.

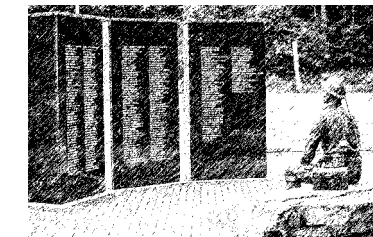

Elliot Lake's uranium miners often risked their lives everyday to support the community and their families. To honour the sacrifices of these workers, granite bricks are available to purchase for anyone who wishes to enshrine their loved ones' name as a permanent feature of the Miners' Memorial Park.

Any person who worked in the Elliot Lake mines in any capacity is eligible, living or deceased. Each brick is a \$150 charitable donation to City, all proceeds supporting the park's ongoing maintenance.

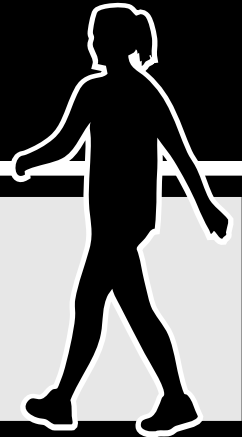

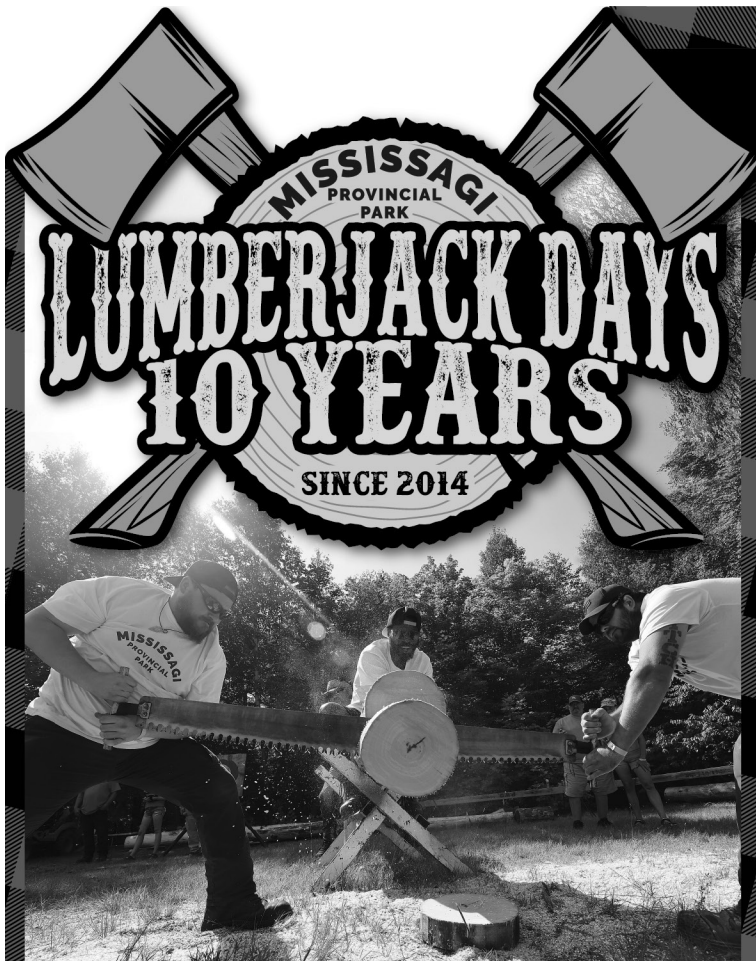
