

Miners' Memorial Wall Criteria

The Elliot Lake Miners' Memorial was erected in 2007 to honour those who lost their lives from working in the Elliot Lake mines. The names of these fallen workers are engraved on the four Memorial Walls in tribute of their services to our community. The statue of the miner keeps constant company to his friends who passed away, their names illuminated permanently under the soft glow of his headlamp.

Definition of the Worker to be placed on the Memorial:

A mine worker who was employed in any occupation related to the mining camps in Elliot Lake and who passed away from either:

- a. A mining accident; or
- b. An occupational disease/illness that is recognized and confirmed by the Workplace Safety and Insurance Board (WSIB).

The names of all approved inductees will be added to the Memorial each year for the Day of Mourning, April 28, where they will be recognized in a ceremony. The names will be full and complete legal names, with the first name followed by the surname. Middle names, nicknames, and suffixes will be considered on an individual basis. The names will be engraved in random order.

Future inductees for the Memorial will be reviewed and approved by the Miners' Memorial Name Selection Subcommittee, a working group of the Elliot Lake Museum Advisory Board. This Subcommittee shall be comprised of members of the Museum Board, qualified resources, and staff. Reporting of this Subcommittee is to the Museum Board, on to the Recreation and Culture Standing Committee, then to Council.
