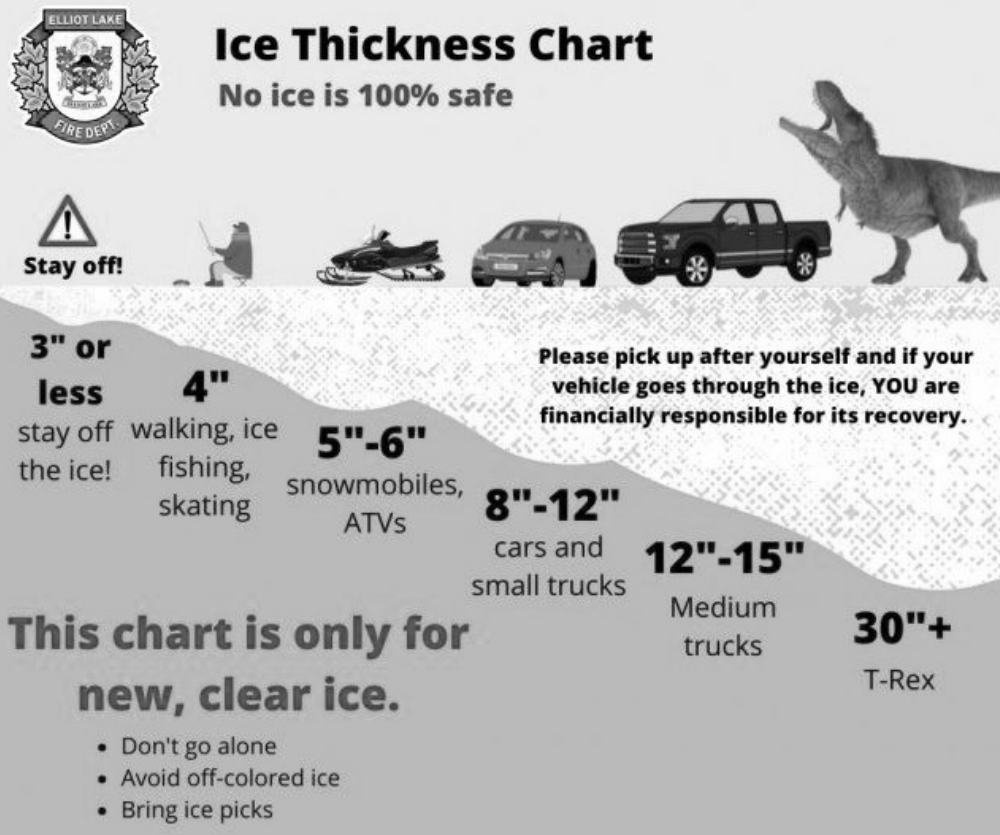

BE PREPARED FOR EXTREME COLD AND SNOW



Extreme cold puts everyone at risk; however, the risks are greater for young children, older adults, and people with chronic illnesses, people working or exercising outdoors, and those without proper shelter. Adverse health effects can occur as a direct result of exposure to excessive cold such as hypothermia and frostbite.

Signs/Symptoms	
Hypothermia	Frostbite
Shivering, exhaustion, confusion, fumbling/uncoordinated movements, memory loss, slurred speech, drowsiness.	White/grayish skin area, skin that feels unusually firm or waxy, or numbness.

Consult a healthcare provider or call Telehealth Ontario (1-866-797-0000 or TTY at 1-877-797- 0007) if you experience any of the above symptoms.

BEST PRACTICES TO FOLLOW

If you must go outside, cover up and dress warmly with several layers. The outer layer should be wind resistant. Frostbite can develop within minutes to exposed skin, especially with wind chill. Avoid overexertion when shovelling snow and take several breaks.

Check on older family, friends and neighbours.

Bring pets inside.

Carry an emergency car kit and a mobile phone, as well as keep others informed of travel schedules and destinations.

Prepare a 72-hour emergency kit in the event that there is a power outage or other impacts to critical infrastructure, as well as consider and prepare alternative means for heat that are safe indoors.

Continue to monitor local forecasts for public weather alerts and exercise appropriate caution if you must travel.

CLERK'S CORNER

DID YOU KNOW...?

There are three (3) ways you can address Council or a Committee of Council:

1. Public Input

You must register to speak through the Clerk's office no later than noon on the day of the Council or Committee meeting. A person is allowed 2 minutes to speak and shall be restricted to comments pertaining to subjects that appear on the agenda for that specific meeting.

2. Public Presentation

Any person wishing to make a Presentation to Council or a Committee shall submit a request to the Clerk by 4:00 PM three (3) business days prior to the meeting at which the person desires to be heard, stating the nature of the business to be discussed. A presentation is for the purpose of addressing a new issue or an issue which may be of general interest or concern to a committee or the general public.

3. Delegation

Any person wishing to appear as a Delegation to a Council or Committee shall submit a request to the Clerk by 4:00 PM on the business day immediately preceding the meeting at which the person desires to be heard. A delegation is for the purpose of directly addressing an item listed on the agenda as being under consideration at that meeting.

* Note that, if City Hall can verify your pet has been spayed/neutered, you will receive a discount on your pet tag

You must have proof that your pet has been spayed or neutered to qualify for a reduced rate on pet tags, as well as proof of rabies vaccination. All dogs and cats in the Elliot lake area must be licensed and the tag must be attached to your dog or cat at all times.

As per By-law 22-100 the maximum number of pets per residence is 5; no more than 3 dogs or 3 cats.
