Transfer of License (no discount) \$5.00 +HST

\* Note that, if City Hall can verify your pet has been spayed/neutered, you will receive a discount on your pet tag

You must have proof that your pet has been spayed or neutered to qualify for a reduced rate on pet tags, as well as proof of rabies vaccination. All dogs and cats in the Elliot lake area must be licensed and the tag must be attached to your dog or cat at all times.

As per By-law 22-100 the maximum number of pets per residence is 5; no more than 3 dogs or 3 cats.

**PLEASE CLEAR THE SNOW!**

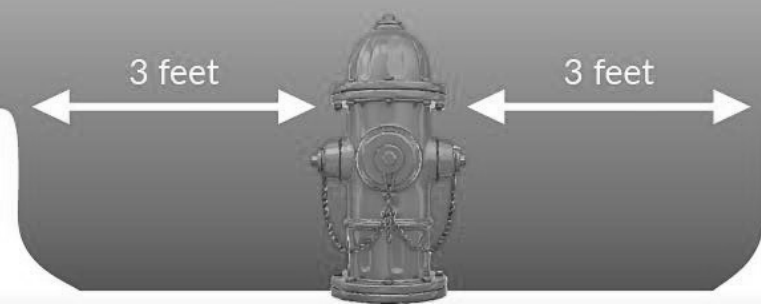
As the snow begins to pile up this winter the city of Elliot Lake and the Fire Chief would like to remind people to please be a good neighbour and keep the fire hydrants around your property clear of any snow or ice build-up. If you use a contractor to keep your driveway clear please ask them to keep any fire hydrants on your property clear of snow as well.

In the event of an emergency, every second counts and a blocked fire hydrant could put lives at risk. Help keep everyone safe by lending a helping hand and making sure that fire hydrants are clear and accessible for fire crews.

**Keep Fire Hydrants Clear of Snow**

*Every second counts in an emergency*

- Remove snow and ice from the hydrant
- Clear an area approximately 3 feet around the hydrant
- Clear a path from the hydrant to the street

The City would like to remind residents that By-law 21 - 48 states "A power device excludes equipment used to remove snow or ice" which under section 3.6 allows the use of snow removal equipment at any time during the day or night.

The City would like to remind residents that Pursuant to By-Law 21-08 the Snow and Ice By-law it is illegal to push snow across the travel portion of the roadway before or after the plow has gone by.

The fine for this is \$305.00
